The Board of Directors of the Santiam Canyon School District 129J, Linn and Marion counties, met with Todd Miller, in attendance was Jamey Fawcett, Mary Richards, Mary Schenk, Angie Fencl with Jeremy Tinney via phone on September 14, 2022.

- 1.0 <u>Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance:</u> Jamey Fawcett called the board meeting to order at 5:32 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

- 5.0 Oral Reports
 - Allison Galvin, Oregon Charter Academy Allison Galvin was not present, Todd shared that the Open House is coming up on Sept 16th, and will be held on the Santiam campus. Things are rolling along, but the enrollment is down considerably.
 - Angela Rasmussen, Jr./Sr. High School Principal In addition to her written report shared that enrollment is at 309, up about 20 kids from June, but we are relative to last September. Outdoor School is starting next week, kudos and thanks to an Instructional Aide at SES for stepping up and offering to help with camp. A big "shout out" to Mr. Forste, Coach Ruby, and so many others for a spur of the moment rescheduling of a football game due to the scheduled power outage. Also thanks to St. Paul School District for working with us and being so gracious to make the game happen. We are offering a 2nd breakfast to our Jr./Sr. High School students. Normally the early breakfast brings in 20 students, we are now serving 80+ students 2nd breakfast. We are working thru some curriculum issues with Amplify as they are back ordered. We are starting something new with 7th & 8th graders. We have introduced Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) to students. Angela & Debbie are pairing together to teach kindness and building a community to the 8th graders; Blane and Amy have paired to facilitate SEL learning time with the 7th graders. This happens every Monday. Ms. Wilson's new class teaches healthy active lifestyles, including light walking, light aerobics and nutrition, it's been great to see the students supporting each other.
 - 5.3 Corrine McGinnis, Santiam Elementary Principal In addition to her written report Corrine shared that enrollment is at 255, up 18 from last year. We're off to a great start! First week was just 1st through 5th graders and Kindergarten started this week. It was fun to see the kid's reaction to all the new playground facilities. The upgrades to the signage are great. The rock wall has been refurbished. Fresh Paint around on some exterior surfaces. The gym has new mats installed on the walls. Professional development includes, limitless potential of all students and an activity to address serving all kids. New K-5 Language Arts curriculum has been introduced, and the teachers embraced it. We also had new curriculum in SPED. We had our first Tiger assembly. Hot meals are being served during breakfast in the classrooms. Office staff have been doing a great job. We also welcomed four new teachers, four instructional assistants and a new custodian
 - Todd Miller, Superintendent Todd shared how good it feels this year. Both buildings are off to a great start. We are happy that we were able to provide the summer programs. We are now offering free lunch through the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP). Basically, we should be making about \$3K more in revenue with this program based on how many kids ate last year. That figure could rise, if we have more kids eating, which is very possible with the new 2nd meal going so well. The projects are almost done, with the HVAC system a bit delayed but coming along due to supply chain issues. The shop roof is almost complete. The paving on 2nd St. is almost complete. Our new 2nd gymnasium is getting new floors, due to the fact that the boards are warping, the contractor will come out to sand the floor and repaint. Just trying to determine when? We will be getting wildfire relief funds, but have not seen the funds yet. He shared that he had to make a decision to cancel school last Friday, due to the scheduled power outage. Kudos to the staff that served over the weekend to keep the fire system charged. We notified the parents via our school messenger system. Concession stands may need to pay fees, not sure where it will fall, but we're working on it. Good to see the ADM numbers coming up for the future.
